Shyam Lal College (SLC), a co-educational constituent college of the University of Delhi, was established in 1964 by the great visionary and entrepreneur Padmashree (late) Shri Shyam Lal Gupta, the then Chairman of Shyam Lal charitable trust. The foundation stone of the College was laid down by Dr. Zakir Hussain, the then Hon'ble Vice President of India. SLC being the oldest and pioneer college in East Delhi has celebrated its Golden Jubilee in 2014. The College has become the center of academic excellence since its inception and aims to make quality education accessible to the students, especially girls, from economically and educationally disadvantaged community of East Delhi. Over a period of 54 years, the College has distinguished itself by providing a plethora of courses and PG course with a rich contribution from distinguished faculty in different departments. SLC is recognized for its efforts by receiving 41st rank in NIRF Rankings for colleges of India. The College is fully equipped with state-of-the-art Computer labs, Science labs, Knowledge Resource Center and Library, Sports facilities to upgrade knowledge, skills and capabilities of the students needed for grooming them as future leaders. Our objective is to nourish, nurture and promote holistic higher education, providing equal opportunity to all. Shri Naidu has been elected and re-elected to Rajya Sabha from Karnataka, first in 1998, then again in 2004, 2010 and, in 2016 from Rajasthan. Shri Naidu has been Chairman of Committee on Petitions (2006-09) and Chairman of Committee on Home Affairs (2009-14). He has been Vice-President, Parliamentary Forum on Disaster Management (2011-14) and President of the UN Habitat and presided over the deliberations of 58 members Governing Council (2017-18). Hon'ble Sir has served as Minister of Rural Development (2000-02); Minister of Urban Development, Minister of Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation, Minister of Parliamentary Affairs (2014-17); Minister of Information and Broadcasting (2016-17).

Hon'ble Vice-President has many articles on subjects of political and public interests in leading newspapers to his credit. He has also authored books titled Moving on... Moving Forward: A Year in Office and Selected Speeches of Venkaiah Naidu: Volume I. Shri Naidu has keen interests in areas of agriculture and social work wherein he is engaged in constructive work in the fields of agriculture, health, vocational education & training, animal care and motivating voluntary organizations. Hon'ble Vice-President has been conferred Doctorate for contribution in the Rule of Law, democracy and sustainable development by the University of Peace on March 08, 2019 at Costa Rica.

Earlier, he was Dean of the School of International Studies at JNU and also Professor of Law at the City University of Hong Kong. Professor Tyagi is a Member of the Institut de Droit International, which is the most prestigious body in the field of International law. He is also a member of the American Society of International Law; European Society of International Law; International Law Association; Indian Society of International Law; and Indian Council of World Affairs. He has been on the International Advisory Panel for the American Law Institute's Restatement Fourth, Foreign Relations Law of the United States.

Professor Tyagi has served as a Member of the Law Commission of India; Director of the Centre for Studies and Research in International Law and International Relations, The Hague Academy of International Law, The Netherlands, 2015 (the English-speaking section); and Co-Chair of the Research and Planning Committee of the Asian Society of International Law. Professor Tyagi has held visiting appointments at the London School of Economics, University of Tokyo, University of Georgia at Athens, the Max Planck Institute for International Law, and many other institutions worldwide. He has published in international periodicals, including the British Year Book of International Law, the Cambridge Journal of International and Comparative Law, the Michigan Journal of International Law, the Texas International Law Journal, Social Science & Medicine, and the Journal of World Trade. He has been on the Editorial Boards of Chinese Journal of International Law (Oxford) and Human Rights & International Legal Discourse (Brussels). Professor Tyagi has special interest in International Law, Law of International Organization, Law of Disarmament, Human Rights Law, Legal Theory, and Globalization.

SLC in the academic session 2018-19

The academic session 2018-19 has seen unprecedented academic and infrastructural developments in the college. The whole SLC team including teachers, students and the non-teaching staff works towards promoting higher education with a view to encourage a more 'learner-centric' approach. SLC strives to achieve these goals through regular curricular monitoring, academic innovations and continuous student involvement in all the College activities.

I proudly announce that our college has secured rank 41 in the MHRD NIRF ranking of colleges in India. I want to congratulate all my teacher colleagues, non-teaching staff and students for this achievement and I am sure of the continued hard work and perseverance of my colleagues so that we achieve better laurels in the years to come.

We are happy to announce that we are going to start new courses – B.Sc (Hons) Chemistry and Mathematics from the coming new semester/academic year. Further, with the active support of the Staff Council and Governing Body of the college, the College has also applied for B.Sc (Hons) Courses in Computer Science and Botany and Postgraduate Courses in Commerce, English, Economics, History and Political Science.

We have also started an add on course on “Stock Market and Expert Trader” in collaboration with Bombay Stock Exchange Ltd. which has successfully completed two batches. The college also offered value added courses on Yoga and Holistic Development (in 2 batches) and Research Analytics for the benefit of the students. In addition to this, the Colleges also began new Foreign Language Courses under the aegis of Department of Germanic & Romance Studies, University of Delhi during the session.

During the year under report, two of our Office staff members got promotions. Mr. Rakesh Singh was promoted to the post of Sr. Assistant and Ms. Veena Tiwari was also promoted to the post of Sr. Assistant. Further, Dr. Shobha Khatri, Associate Professor, Department of Commerce and Mr. Mahender Kumar, Section Officer will be retiring on 31 May, 2018 after dedicating their career to the college.

Research/Consultancy/Collaboration

1. CIMO International Project & Exchange Programme

Continuing with taking the brand SLC to newer heights, the College successfully completed the International Project “Responsible Business Professionals For Finland and India Trade” (1st September 2016 – 31st August 2018) funded by The Center for International Mobility (CIMO), Finland involving Shyam Lal College and three oldest Universities from Finland - Turku School of Economics/ Pori Unit (University of Turku), South Eastern Finland University of Applied Sciences (XAMK), Turku University of Applied Sciences (as Coordinator), Finland. The project was headed by Prof. Rabi Narayan Kar, Principal SLC from the Indian side. It is a matter of pride that the project involved the academic faculty and student exchange in which 4 of our students Mr. Angad Anand, B.Com (H) 3rd year, Mr. Abhishek Bery, B.Com (H) 3rd year, Ms. Shreeya Upadhyay, Eng (H) 3rd year and Ms. Aditi Thakur, Eng (H) 3rd year visited TUAS and XAMK for a period of one month in September 2017 with a faculty Dr. Kusha Tiwari who was a visiting faculty at TUAS and XAMK for two weeks. The next part of the Programme was conducted in Shyam Lal College in March, 2018 in which 6 faculty members and 13 students from the three partner Finnish universities visited our college for one week and participated in the International Winter School on “Fostering Collaborative Innovations and Solutions for Sustainable Development” from 3-7 March, 2018 organized by IQAC, SLC comprising of two day International Conference on “Developing Countries and Sustainable Development: Reconnecting Past with Present” and two International Workshops.

The partner institutions and respective project investigators are in the process of bringing out two published volumes as the outcome of this International project.

3. Working Paper Series

The College engages in another pioneer step with the Working Paper Series in which the faculty members of the College are given an opportunity to upload their original research papers on the College website after a rigorous review process by engaging external experts.

BEST PRACTICES

1. Student Mentoring Programme

SLC has successfully implemented mentorship programme through IQAC of the college, for all the students. Under this full fledged mentorship programme, all the students are assigned to designated faculty members during their stay in the college.

2. Community Outreach Programme

Under this, we have successfully adopted Shahdara Mandi and Hanuman Seva Basti, Jhilmil for several welfare measures like no use of plastic bags and promoting use of recycled products, health check up camps, awareness about several welfare schemes of the Govt.

3. Powered by Renewable Energy

The Solar Power Plant of the College is fully functional and generates power for our consumption and whenever there is any surplus it goes back to Delhi homes. The Solar Power Plant, installed in the college, is a collaborative initiative with IPGCL, Govt. of NCT of Delhi wherein the said govt. agency has borne the full cost of the installation of the Solar Panels in the college. We have been saving power as well as financial resources since the plant became fully functional. The College also practices regular switch off drives so as to save and conserve energy.

4. East Delhi Flower Show 2019

SLC organised, for the first time, "East Delhi Flower Show 2019" in collaboration with DCP Office Delhi Police Shahdara on 22nd Feb., 2019. Various kinds of flora were displayed in the college ground and were appreciated and enjoyed by students, teachers and other spectators. The college is going to maintain this as an annual practice.

5. Innovation Cell

SLC Innovation Cell has been operationalized and accredited to Institution's Innovation Council, MHRD, GOI. Under the Innovation Cell, the college has already two student projects namely ZORGO and Safety First to the Idea Competition organized by Cluster Innovation Centre, University of Delhi which have successful for the next level.

6. Green Initiatives

Conservation of environment has been the focus of assurance of the College. The students, faculty, office staff and other staff of the College work in coordination to cultivate and preserve a green environment.

- The College is a tobacco-free, smoke-free zone and has said a loud 'NO' to crackers and plastic bags.
- The College takes special care to inculcate the habit of switching off fans and lights when these are not in use.
- All garden waste is used for making compost in compost pits.
- Burning of garden waste is strictly prohibited on the Campus to minimize air pollution.
- E-waste is routed through appropriate channels for proper disposal
- Colleges also engages in regular tree plantation drives in and around the campus.
- College took efforts for carbon neutrality, with large green-patches, gardens and a vast collection of trees.
- College has installed three LED screens to communicate with students and faculty to reduce the use of paper in printing official notices etc.
- The Garden Committee attempts to ensure the use of natural fertilizers and natural material for supporting plants and climbers.

7. Rain Water Harvesting

As an institution committed to zero water wastage and harnessing the power of every drop of this precious commodity, SLC has taken important measure like installing rain water harvesting system in the campus.

8. Recycling Papers

SLC is sensitive towards the cause of conserving natural resources and promotes the culture of respecting nature. SLC in collaboration with NGO Jagriti recycles waste paper and in return has receives several reams of paper.

9. LED Lights

The usage of LED lights has reduced the power consumption heavily. The installation of LED lights following the installation of solar panels has helped the College save its financial resources. In addition to this, switch-off drills are carried out on regular basis to make the SLCians aware and alert regarding energy consumption and saving.

10. Assessment and Feedback

The College has also successfully implemented the structured feedback system that ensures that the concerns of the students are heard and addressed. So far we have successfully completed two cycles of taking holistic feedback

from the students that have been analyzed and the issues related to academics, infrastructure and facilities raised have been addressed. Along with this, the IQAC also takes feedback on curriculum from different stakeholders. The action taken report is subsequently prepared and discussed with the different departments.

11. Opportunities for neighbourhood under-privileged School children to participate/coaching facility for different games

Shyam Lal College is the foremost college in East Delhi Campus of the University of Delhi with outstanding sports facilities for games like Hockey, Baseball, Volleyball, Judo and Kabaddi. The College aims at promotion and improvement of sports and games in trans-Yamuna region of Delhi by providing opportunities and best coaching facilities to the young and talented players of the society. The college has taken this initiative to provide free and regular coaching in the above mentioned games to deserving and talented students from neighboring schools. The aim is also to promote indigenous games among the youth who are in some ways unaware of the vast career possibilities to be explored in our national games and sports.

12. Active participation in Cashless & Digital India

The College understands its accountability towards the financial resources and so has decided to adopt the practice of “Cashless” under “Digital India”. The College has very efficiently and dedicatedly participated in MHRD's Digital Economy Project Vittiya Saksharata Abhiyan (VISAKA).

13. Going Digital

The College is highly committed to adopt digital practices in all office and students related work. IQAC collaborates with various departments to organize virtual lectures and talks and interviews of imminent personalities across the world. The College also encourages the faculty to record lectures through screencast-o-matic v2.0 software for future reference and benefit of the students.

The Administration took the digitalization one step further by transfiguring the students' I-cards into Single Sign-on (SSO) card. This card bearing bar-code is an in-house product developed by the technical team of the college. This one stop card is revolutionary as it makes the entire data just one click away and so is less time-consuming with minimum chances of being faulty and ensures better access to the on-campus facilities like:

- a) Issuing books in library - the students can issue books with the help of SSO card and they would not require any separate library card.
- b) Security - It makes screening easier on special days like student elections, College fest, annual function etc. to avoid any scuffles and untoward incidents in the campus.
- c) Payment of bills - the College is also thinking of creating a pay wallet which will be connected with students' account so as to make their campus experience better.

The Administration is virtually in touch with the non-teaching staff all the time during office hours. All the officials of the College are connected with the Principal through Google worksheet where routine jobs are assigned to concerned officials and are routinely monitored.

The College teaching staff is always updated with real-time LED display in the staffroom which is used for the display of time-table and other important notices.

14. Inclusive Education and Development

The practice of Inclusive Education and Development continues from the last year as it serves meaningful benefit for the students. Since the location of the College is very strategic, the students from NCR/East Delhi get the maximum benefit of studying in a premier Delhi University college. The College gives value-based education to the students (as is the vision of the College) and also takes care of the professionalism of the Industry/market and prepares the students for the competitive world outside. Remedial classes, workshops organized by different departments, Placement Cell and Skill Development Cell, industry interaction through CIISD give the students enough exposure and feel of the professional world.

15. University Chef

Shyam Lal College proudly and successfully hosted the fourth edition of SLC University Chef 2019 in association with Bright flames, a culinary competition on 28th February and 1st March, 2019. In this inter-college competition, 17 teams representing various colleges of DU, Delhi/NCR and other states participated exhibiting their culinary arts. The convenor, Mr. Abbasuddin Tapadar and co-convenor Dr. Supriti Mishra convened the competition by felicitating the Principal, Prof. Rabi Narayan Kar and the jury members - celebrity Chef Nita Mehta, Chef Mukesh Kumar, Chef Veeta Singh and Master chef India fame Chef Jatin Khurana.

The Jury oriented the participants of culinary ethics and aesthetics and gave some valuable tips about how to express oneself through this art and how to make the best of limited ingredients. The Principal, Prof. Rabi Narayan Kar and the Jury members dedicated the Competition to the martyrs of Pulwama attack. Prof. Kar said that as a chef one can participate in nation building by serving the army.

The winner slot was claimed by the team Ravleen and Asmita of Lady Irwin College, University of Delhi, while team Ruqayya and Namra from Laxmi Bai College, University of Delhi and team Vasant and Surender from Kirori Mal College, University of Delhi, bagged second and third positions respectively.

This competition is an annual feature organized by the College and is one of its kind in Delhi University.

Academic Innovations

SLC has taken the pioneering initiative since 2015-16 by starting the Public lecture series under which the College has already organized five Virtual lectures with global experts through SKYPE software, which turned out to be a very enriching experience for the students as well as the faculty members. While the two virtual lectures were organized in the academic year 2015-16, two lectures were organized in the academic year 2016-17 and one lecture was organized in 2017-18 and one in 2018-19. The virtual lecture in 2018-19 was delivered by Prof. Bidyut Baran Saha, Professor and Principal Investigator of International Institute for Carbon-neutral energy Research, Kyushu University, Japan. The lecture was on how to write a scientific paper in a peer reviewed journal which was very beneficial for first time authors as they got to know the nuances of a scientific paper. Those who have already published their work got to know the various areas where a scientific paper can be improved and get published in high impact peer reviewed journal.

Interdisciplinary Student Research project 2018-19

Academic Affairs and Monitoring Committee of Shyam Lal College under convenorship of Dr. Kusha Tiwari, Assistant Professor, Department of English and mentorship of Prof. Rabi Narayan Kar, Principal started Interdisciplinary Student Research projects in August 2018. 13 research project proposals were received from students across different courses. First round of selection happened in the last week of September 2018, in which best 5 proposals were shortlisted. The second round of final result was held in October 2018, in which the committee invited Prof. Debasis Dash, Senior Principal Scientist, Institute of Geonimics & Integrative Biology (CSIR) as the expert judge. The students presented their proposals before him and he appreciated their effort and innovative ideas. Out of 5 shortlisted proposals, three project proposals - Parivartan; Food Follow; Gas Leakage Detector were selected on the recommendation of Prof Debasis Dash, to be taken to the next level and be funded by the committee towards completion.

Faculty Development Program by Academic Affairs and Monitoring Committee and IQAC

Academic Affairs and Monitoring Committee (AAMC) and Internal Quality Assurance Committee (IQAC) of SLC, University of Delhi in collaboration with National Institute of Educational Planning and Administration (NIEPA) and Guru Angad Dev Teaching and Learning Centre (under Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching, Government of India) organized a Faculty Development Programme titled “Emerging Areas of Engagement in Pedagogy and Research” spanning from 24-30, November, 2018. It registered 80 faculty members from across Delhi University and some other colleges of other universities. It's worthwhile to mention that, the FDP hosted some of the well-known academics and resource persons on the subjects concerned. Overall, in 24 sessions, 25 experts engaged in discussions and interactions with the participants. The programme became a successful endeavor under the guidance of Prof. Rabi Narayan Kar, Principal and convenorship of Dr. Kusha Tiwari.

The programme was inaugurated by Prof. N. V. Verghese, Vice-Chancellor NIEPA, Prof. Aswini Kumar Mohapatra, Center for West Asian Studies at Jawaharlal Nehru University and Member of ICSSR, Prof. Veera Gupta, NIEPA and former Secretary, CBSE, Prof. Rabi Narayan Kar, Principal, Shyam Lal College, University of Delhi. Prof. Rabi Narayan Kar, Principal, Shyam Lal College in his inaugural address drew the attention of the participants to the attributes of the new age students and their growing expectations from the teachers as facilitators.

Prof. N. V. Verghese as the Chief Guest of the inaugural session identified the developments in global trends in education primarily in three stages in the modern times. The first stage as identified by him was a post second world war period as carried through with the Marshal plan strategies marked by the state led investment in education, its development and growth. The second stage is the transformation experienced by the educational field as ushered in an era of globalization particularly since 1980s where market took lead and state withdrew from educational funding, management and regulation. The third stage, he said, was the post crisis period i.e. after 2008 in which the state was again called but in the different format.

Other resource persons included Prof. Sudhanshu Bhushan, Professor and Head of the Department of Higher and Professional Education, NIEPA; Prof. Meenakshi Gopinath, renowned educationist; AK Bakshi, Vice-Chancellor, PDM University, Bahadurgarh; Dr. Vimal Rarh, SGTB Khalsa College, DU; Prof. Veera Gupta, NIEPA; Prof. K. CENTERS

CIISD

CIISD, The Centre for Industry Interaction and Skill Development, has been set up to promote interaction as well as collaboration of SLC with industry for mutual benefit. It operates through its 3 constituent cells, viz. the Placement Cell, the Skill Development Cell and the Entrepreneurship Cell, and also as an umbrella organization, wherein the 3 cells come together to organize events of common interest. During the year the 3 cells continued to thrive in their respective areas.

Placement Cell

- The SLC Placement Cell, apart from hosting placement and internship drives in the College, organizes seminars and workshops to guide the students and to help them to successfully participate in these drives. The Cell continuously strives to ensure that the best companies offering good job profiles and packages visit our campus. MNCs including Royal Bank of Scotland and Asahi India Glass Ltd. and reputed Indian companies have become a part of our placement calendar on a regular basis. Among the companies visiting our campus for the first time was a MNC named DGITO Technical Services with several challenging

roles on offer. During the current session, the Cell has conducted campus placement drives/facilitated off-campus placement drives by companies in which various students registered and some of them were selected/shortlisted. The Cell also facilitated the participation of our students in Central Placement Process of University of Delhi, besides informing them of the placement drives being conducted by other Colleges of the University in which our students are welcome to participate.

- The Cell also carried out campus internship drives by companies like Gen Pact and Sharekhan and enabled off-campus internship drives by companies like Mazars India. Many students participated in drives and some of them were selected. As of now, more placement and internship drives are in the pipeline.
- During the year, the Cell organized seminars and workshops on diverse subjects such as “How to improve Vocabulary”, “How to crack GD” and “What Recruiters are looking for”. The Cell also organized a psychometric test by professionals to help the students individually in the process of placement. In recent years many of our students have starting looking for education and employment opportunities in other countries, and the Cell has been trying to take upon itself the responsibility to pass on all relevant information available at its disposal, to our students.

E-Cell

E-Cell SLC, the foundations of which were laid down in the year 2016, was re-formed in the year 2018-19. Soon after the reformation, the new team began with the hustles to attain the same pace of activities and events as was in the previous years.

- The team members exhibited their presentation skills and innovative ideas to the faculty members of E-Cell on 4th September 2018 and we got to see some insightful business plans worth pursuing. Soon after, on 11th September 2018, the team members were sent in groups to visit incubation centers all around the city to interview and interact with some of the most innovative startups. Members learned a lot about the real challenges faced by those startups and what kept them going to achieve their goals.
- Next, the team members organized a speaker session, 'Psychy of an Entrepreneur', on 24th September 2018, addressed by Psychologist and motivational speaker Mr. Gaurav Gill. Mr. Gill focused on how Psychology and Entrepreneurship co-relate, bringing up topics such as how mental situations like Bipolar Disorder and Obsessive Compulsive Personality Disorder (OCPD) can, and have affected entrepreneurship, etc. He also talked about notable personalities such as Elon Musk and Macarthur 'genius', Angela Lee Duckworth.
- Another speaker session organized by the team was 'Entrepreneur Speaks', on 8th October 2018, addressed by Mr. Kirtiman Sharma, the founder of Hustle Co-Work. He unfolded his experience as an entrepreneur, telling how it requires passion and determination, how he tackled the fundamental setbacks that came up with his first startup and also what induced him to institute Hustle CoWork. We ended that knowledge rich

day with a fun and creative competition, 'Think with the Box', wherein the participants displayed their creativity, marketing skills, and managerial potentials.

- One major achievement by the E-Cell SLC was when 3 of our projects were selected for the final round of a B-Plan competition, 'Saudagar', organized by the SAKSHAM, the E-Cell of IIM Udaipur during their annual fest, 'SOLARIS'18'. Two of our members went to IIM Udaipur on 3rd and 4th of November, 2018 to represent SLC, and unveiled 3 of our B-Plans namely, ZORGO, INFOLLEGE and FOOD FELLOW in the 2-day competition
- The next semester began with a collaboration of E-Cell SLC and SDC SLC to organize a National level Skill Development and Startup Fair, 'YUVA SPANDANA'19'. Ambedkar Study Circle (ASC)

In the academic year 2018-19, Ambedkar Study Circle aimed at spreading awareness regarding constitution, equality, women education, Dalit atrocities, reservation, etc., through Dr. Ambedkar's ideas. In this regard, the following events were organized:

- ASC celebrated the Constitution Day (26th November) on 14.11. 2019 and organized a talk on the topic “Relevance of Constitution in Contemporary India”. The speakers were: Prof. Manoj Kumar Jha, Member of Parliament, Rajya Sabha and Prof. N. Sukumar, Department of Political Science, University of Delhi. Convenor, Mr. Sanoj Kumar and the Principal, Prof. Rabi Narayan Kar welcomed the guest speakers and also oriented the sitting audience about the intent behind introducing Ambedkar Study Circle. While Prof. N. Sukumar came up with theoretical exemplifications in order to stress upon the importance of the Constitution, Prof. Manoj Kumar Jha presented a nuanced view about the Constitution through his experiences as a Member of Parliament. Both of them talked about caste discrimination and defended the need for reservation. A post-talk discussion was also held between the audience and the guest speakers where a range of questions were asked from the speakers.
- The ASC commemorated the 128th Ambedkar Jayanti on 14.04.2019. A talk was organized to emphasize upon the importance of this celebration. The Speakers were: Dr. Neelam, Assistant Professor, Lakshmi Bai College, Dr. Uma Kant, an independent scholar and Mr. Amar Singh, Former General Secretary, SC/ST Association, DU. Convenor, Mr. Sanoj Kumar formally welcomed the guests. All the three speakers talked about the discrimination at various levels. Dr. Neelam expressed that Dalit women are doubly subjugated by patriarchy. They face exploitation not only by upper caste but also by Dalit men. She also exemplified that Brahmanism as an ideology has pervaded Dalit Samaaj as well and this has to be done away with. Dr. Umakant highlighted the discrimination in academics that how the idiosyncratic attitude of high caste academicians who still view Dalits through their stereotypical mind set as socially and academically inferior. He also explained the problems faced by Dr. Ambedkar in drafting the constitution. Mr. Amar Singh also highlighted the discrimination of non-teaching staff by the faculty.
- In response to the letter from the Ministry of Social Justice, the ASC organized an academic trip to Ambedkar Memorial Museum and Ambedkar Foundation. Dr. Ambedkar's political journey and struggle are depicted digitally in the museum. It was a good learning experience for the students and teachers of SLC.
- A one day national seminar was organized on the topic “Dr. B. R. Ambedkar's views on Social Justice, Caste-based Discrimination and Bahujan Identity” on 23.04.2019. The Speakers were Dr. Namdev, Kirorimal College, University of Delhi, Prof. Sheoraj Singh “Bechain”, Hindi Department, University of Delhi, Prof. Chandrabhanu Bharas, Gautam Buddha University, Uttar Pradesh and Dr. Chandra Sen, New School University, New York, USA. Various papers were also presented discussing a wide range of social issues. Both the guest speakers presented their views on caste-based discrimination and Dalit/ Bahujan identity.

Gandhi Study Circle (GSC)

The Gandhi Study Circle, Department of Political Science and IQAC organized a Two-Day National Seminar on “Revisiting Gandhi Through Modernity: Towards a Sustainable Future” on 27th and 28th September 2018.

Eco Club and Innovation Club

The mission of the Eco club is "Go Green initiative" to raise the students' "interest" over environmental issues and to get the students actively involved in environmental matters. The club also seeks to conserve nature's heritage by education and direct conservation efforts to spread awareness about good environmental practices like a ban on plastic, proper dumping of garbage, planting of trees etc. within Shyam Lal College. Different types of plants such as herbal, ornamental, air purifying plants etc. were shown to the students. Further the students were taken to campus visit. Enactus @ SLC was formed in the year 2016 and since then it has never looked back. The society was formed with 3 members initially and today the team has 21 members working on different projects.

Project Prayojya

- Presently the team is working on a community outreach project “PRAYOJYA”.
- Following the valuable direction from our worthy principal sir, we are endeavoring to use all our efforts and entrepreneurial actions to bring out a change that would positively affect each member of the society, bring smiles, empower people and create a more sustainable world.

 - Third Prize In Category C/Class VI (Ranunclus plant)

And two consolation prizes (highly commended) in category A/ class I sec-28 (paper plant) and sec-31 (Mathiola plant).
