- **Facilitating collaboration:** By connecting with external stakeholders, IICs create opportunities for knowledge sharing, resource mobilization, and industry partnerships.


- **Supporting entrepreneurship:** IICs provide incubation and acceleration support to promising startups, helping them transform their ideas into successful ventures.

Recommendations


Based on the session summaries, the following recommendations can be made:


- Strengthen IICs by providing adequate resources and support.

- Conduct regular assessments and evaluations to measure the impact of IIC initiatives.


By following these recommendations, higher education institutions can significantly enhance their innovation capabilities and produce impactful outcomes.
