This demographic shift is particularly significant in India, where the elderly population has surged by 54.77% over the past 15 years, compared to a 42.34% increase in the working-age population. By 2050, nearly 19% of India's population will be aged 60 and above, raising critical socio-economic and healthcare challenges.

Under the Vision Viksit Bharat@2047, ensuring the well-being of the elderly population is essential for achieving inclusive and sustainable growth. As India progresses towards development by 2047, a comprehensive approach to financial security, healthcare, social inclusion, and senior-friendly infrastructure will be crucial in safeguarding the dignity and well-being of its aging population. The rising proportion of elderly citizens necessitates a reassessment of social security frameworks, healthcare provisions, and economic policies. Ensuring the financial independence, healthcare access, and social well-being of this demographic is not just a moral imperative but also an economic necessity. If left unaddressed, these challenges could lead to heightened economic pressures on families, increased dependency ratios, and systemic strains on public welfare programs.

The Conference seeks to address these pressing concerns by bringing together a diverse group of stakeholders, including policymakers, academicians, researchers, healthcare

professionals, industry leaders, and representatives from civil society organizations. The conference aims to foster critical discussions, policy innovations, and multi-sectoral collaborations to create sustainable and inclusive solutions for elderly welfare.
