Squid Games was one of the most thrilling and high-energy events of Economica'25, designed to test participants' strategy, adaptability, and decision-making under pressure. With 102 registrations, the competition featured a series of elimination-based challenges, inspired by traditional childhood games but with an added strategic twist.

The event consisted of six intense rounds:

- **Red Light, Green Light:** Conducted in two rounds due to the large number of participants, narrowing the field to 37.
- **Marbles Showdown:** Players formed pairs, competing to collect the most marbles. Nine players advanced, with one extra player moving forward by default.
- **Mingle:** Participants moved in circles while music played, quickly forming groups based on randomly announced numbers. By the end, only six remained.
- **Ultimate Showdown:** Each player picked a chit that determined their game, ranging from flipping challenges to traditional skill-based tasks. Four finalists emerged.
- **Both-Hand Stone Paper Scissors:** A fast-paced round that reduced the final four to the last two standing competitors.
- **Split or Steal:** The final decision that determined the ultimate winner, where strategy and trust played a crucial role.
