BEST PRACTICES (2023-24)

- 1. Adoption of Villages: SLC actively participates in the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and has embraced the responsibility of fostering development in five villages located in Uttar Pradesh: Dhitora (Baghpat), Nithora, Chirodi, Jawli, and Kotwalpur (all in Ghaziabad). Through this initiative, the UBA team has meticulously conducted surveys and engaged in dialogue with villagers, village Pradhans, village panchayat samities, and other pertinent stakeholders. These interactions, along with comprehensive data collection and village visits, have enabled the team to identify key areas requiring intervention. Drawing from this groundwork, the SLC team has devised and implemented awareness campaigns targeting financial literacy, computer training, government financial incentives and schemes, insurance plans, and health insurance. Additionally, workshops have been organised to raise awareness about sanitation issues, water conservation, waste management, and the avoidance of polythene usage. Practical solutions, such as the distribution of cloth bags, have also been implemented to facilitate proper waste management practices in these villages.
- 2. Adoption and Spreading of Sustainable Practices (Greenary, Swachta and Renewable Power): At SLC, adoption and spreading of sustainable practices include creating green campus, regular cleanliness drives, use of renewable power derived from the solar panel installed in the campus and participating in the GOI's initiatives such as Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Swachhata Pakhwada and Swachhata Action Plan(SAP). These initiatives in the college are in tune with Sustainable Development Goals as adopted by the United Nations in 2015 and also the environmental friendly approach enshrined in the National Educational Policy (NEP), 2020. These practices, undertaken at SLC, aim at adopting various environment friendly initiatives. At SLC, we also aim to generate young students' interest in relation to adopting environment friendly approaches in their day to day lives and also in their vicinity.
