## **REPORT ON STUDENTS' FEEDBACK (2024-25)**

The perfect idea of a robust education system is the one which is student centric. The students have always been an integral part of the College. The key measure of College's development can be easily figured out by the holistic development of its students. In order to gather the perception of students for the academic session 2024-25, a questionnaire with ten parameters has been circulated. The data set comprises of representative and convenience sampling. The collected data points from 385 students are analysed on a 5-point Like scale. The scale measures the responses as Extremely Satisfied, Satisfied, Neither Satisfied nor Dissatisfied, Dissatisfied or Extremely Dissatisfied. The Table demonstrates the average responses observed on the given scale as against the respective parameters. As a higher (or lower) proportion of students respond as Extremely Satisfied and Satisfied (or Extremely Dissatisfied and Dissatisfied), indicates the parameter in favour of (or against) Students and highlights that the College is attaining (or deviating from) its goal.




Figure: Average Students' Responses observed

The questionnaire has been constructed on the parameters: Academic Resources (faculty), Academic Activities, Skill Enhancement, Co-Curricular and Extra-Curricular, Extension and Outreach, Administrative/Office Staff, Infrastructure, Grievance Redressal Mechanism, Institutional Social Responsibility Activities, Impact of College on Your Life. The students' feedback analysis can be concluded as follows:

- 1. The *Academic Resources* of SLC have been appreciated by the students as shown in Table (Average Responses observed on 5-point scale in percentage). The parameter Academic Resources includes Mentoring and Motivation, Curriculum based questions, Regularity and Sincerity, Subject Expertise, Evaluation and performance etc. The institution has been promoting the students to indulge in beyond the classroom learning and more than 59.29% (11.17% extremely satisfied and 48.12% satisfied) of the students are satisfied with these resources.
- 2. The *Academic Activities* majorly include Seminars/Conferences/Special Lectures, Hands on Training for Academic Enhancement, Class Presentations/ Projects/Workbooks, Cinema in Classrooms, Multidisciplinary projects etc. The activities are appreciated by a major segment of pupils and upto 45.28% of them are content by the same.
- 3. The *College Activities* are further extended to Skill Enhancement Activities. This parameter has enquired about the Associations/Clubs, Career Counselling and Placement Support etc. The students' much favourite extension activities have impelled them to address a satiety level of 46.43%.
- 4. The *Co-Curricular* and *Extra-Curricular* involvement of students has been covering Sports, Cultural Societies/Centres and Departmental Associations. 49.35% Students are content with these engagements.
- 5. Around 51.12% students are satisfied by the *Extension and Outreach activities* which encompasses their involvement in Eco-Club, Sanitation and Hygiene, Remedial Classes, Community Outreach Programmes, NSS/NCC etc.
- 6. The students' lot has shown an active response in favour of the *administrative/office* dealing framework and Infrastructural resources. It has been observed that the 61.30%, 48.39% and 45.97% students have had optimum support from *Administrative Staff*, *College Infrastructure* and *Grievance Redressal Mechanism* respectively.

- 7. The institution is often associated to serve its *social responsibility* by promoting the students towards Green Campus-Tree Plantation Drive, Implementation of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Gender Sensitization Programs for awareness. The 62.29% of the respondents often admired the College's initiatives for the Institutional Social Responsibility.
- 8. And lastly, an affirmative *Impact of College on the Student's Life* has also been observed by as large as 58.44% of them. The College imparts Value based Education and endorses the Holistic Development for the future of the nation.

## **Action Taken**

Since 24.61% of students disagreed with Skill Enhancement learning, the College would be offering a variety of *Skill* Enhancement courses and *Add-on Courses* from academic session 2025-26. The issue can be further addressed with mentoring and counselling about the career opportunities and possibilities of higher education progression.

As 27.14% respondents disagreed with the *Academic Activities*, the College has planned to organise more Seminars, Conferences, Workshops, Special Lectures, Guest Lectures, Virtual Lectures, Hands on Training for Academic Enhancement (Software, Simulation, databanks etc.) and Multidisciplinary Projects / Live Projects.
