REPORT ON FILM MAKING WORKSHOP

Workshop Overview: The Falcon Film Society, in collaboration with GS Studios India, organised an engaging and insightful filmmaking workshop for our members. The session aimed to provide budding filmmakers with a strong foundation in both the creative and technical aspects of filmmaking. The topics covered ranged from the earliest stage of planning to the final stages of post-production, ensuring a complete learning experience for participants.

Topics Covered:

1. **Pre-Production and Planning** – Understanding the importance of a clear vision, script breakdown, shot planning, and scheduling before stepping onto the set.

- 2. **Basics of Photography** Learning framing, composition, lighting basics, and how photography skills enhance filmmaking.
- 3. **Film Genres and Styles** –Exploring different genres, their visual language, and storytelling approaches.
- 4. **Aperture, ISO, and Shutter Speed** Understanding camera settings and how they affect image brightness, depth of field, and motion blur.
- 5. **Sound Design and Lighting Techniques** Exploring creative and technical methods for achieving professional audio quality and impactful lighting.
- 6. Camera Shots, Angles, and Movements Learning how camera positioning and motion affect storytelling and audience engagement.
- 7. **Editing and Post-Production Workflow** Understanding the process of selecting shots, arranging sequences, adding sound, colour correction, and finalising a polished film.

Outcomes:

- Participants gained a deeper understanding of the filmmaking process from concept to completion.
- Improved technical skills in handling cameras and setting up lighting for different moods and scenes.
- Learned how to match camera work and sound design with the story's tone and purpose.
- Acquired practical editing knowledge to create professional-quality films.
- Boosted creativity and teamwork through interactive Q&A sessions and real-world examples shared by GS Studios experts.

Conclusion: The workshop proved to be an enriching experience for all attendees, especially first-year students who are just starting their filmmaking journey. By combining theory with hands-on guidance, GS Studios and Falcon Film Society provided participants with the confidence and knowledge to explore their

passion for filmmaking. The session left everyone inspired and eager to experiment with fresh ideas, bringing innovative stories to life for future Falcon projects.
